Dr. Mark Hans

Since then, he has divided his time between his private practice and CWRU. He is currently Professor and Chair of the Department of Orthodontics and serves as the Director of the Bolton Brush Growth Study Center. His research interests include Pediatric Sleep Apnea, Emerging Technologies in Orthodontic Practice and Facial Growth and Development.


"Clear, Mostly Sunny with a Chance of Showers - Orthodontics in the 21st Century" Friday, September 13, 8:00am - 9:30am

Since the discovery of the cephalometer in 1931 orthodontic practice has been influenced by evaluation of treatment outcomes with the goal of improving patient care. The three pillars of quality treatment are esthetics, function and stability. All are equally important and the future of our specialty depends on keeping this trilogy intact. This presentation will demonstrate how attention to the fundamental principles of facial growth and development influence orthodontic diagnosis and treatment planning. The critical nature of "core knowledge" to the survival of our specialty will be highlighted. There will also be a focus on the impact of technology on orthodontic practice, especially three-dimensional imaging, and CAD/CAM in the private orthodontic office. In addition, the role of the orthodontist in pediatric and adult sleep apnea will be reviewed. After this presentation the audience should be convinced that our future is "mostly sunny".

- Understand the impact of facial growth on orthodontic treatment.
- Describe the role of the orthodontist on the sleep team.
- Understand the work flow for manufacturing custom aligners in an orthodontic office.
- Know why the trilogy along with core knowledge is critical to the future of our specialty.

"Managing OSA in a Busy Orthodontic Office"

Friday, September 13, 10:00am – 11:00am

With more than 80 respiratory disorders, the orthodontist can play a big role helping children and adults, specially regarding Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA). This presentation will show how the orthodontist can help identify and manage OSA in pediatric and adult patients, from using oral appliances, to surgical movement of the jaws, and newest hypoglossal stimulation methods. When moving from 2D to 3D, distances and angles turn into areas and volumes, and understanding the airway may take orthodontics to the next level, increasing the scope of what can be done clinically.

Maxillary lateral agenesis in the permanent dentition occurs in 2% of the population, and canine-lateral substitution is a common treatment option, particularly for the adolescent patient. Despite the lasting benefits of canine substitution, these cases often have compromised esthetic results. This fun and fast-paced presentation will review steps to enhance the esthetics of the canine-lateral substitution patient. We will review important topics such a bracket positioning, torque, elastics, finishing bends, cosmetic bonding, and retention. Be ready to take home a handful of clinical pearls to enhance your substitution cases!

- Learn finishing techniques with wire bends and elastics.
