ADA Resolution 16S-4

The ADA recently passed a resolution to update/amend the **ADA Policy Statement on Teledentistry.**

The ADA defines Teledentistry as a two-way interaction between a person defined as a patient, caregiver or provider using audiovisual telecommunications technology to deliver patient care or education. Teledentistry telecommunication technology has advanced over the past five years. In order to protect the oral health and safety of patients, assure their continuity of care and to provide states with guidance to ensure that licensed dentists are leaders of the dental team and in control of the practice of dentistry. The amendment removes validation language of modality and allows states and/or districts to develop internal policy. It also provides further patient protections by stating that the information collected during a Teledentistry encounter must be equivalent to that of an in-person exam, and the dentist is legally responsible for collecting this information.
