Report from the PAC Representative.

Since the annual session there have been two significant developments. The first is an extension of what I reported at that meeting. Changes in the by laws now permit the PAC to contribute at the state level. At a recent ad hoc COGA/PAC meeting in St. Louis, steps were taken to reorganize our advocacy efforts with an emphasis on state engagement. I expect this will be covered in COGA report.

Although PAC dollars were not used in this case, it is an example of state advocacy that the AAO contributed \$20,000 from the Legal Support Fund to support Issue 2 in Massachusetts. This issue requires dental insurers to submit medical loss ratios to state regulators and to refund excess premiums to customers if the annual medical loss ratio is less than 83%. The loss ratio measures the amount spent on dental expenses and quality improvements. The issue passed decisively.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our contributing members for their contributions in the month of September. The GLAO contributions in September were \$4629.00.

Compare this to August contributions, \$1499.00 (a more typical number)! Outstanding!

I am sure that the annual session effort contributed to this gratifying increase. It nevertheless demonstrates that the GLAO is ready, willing, and able to step up. Thanks to all.
